Who?

Who will benefit from this project?

The playground upgrade at the Douglas County Recreation Area will directly benefit children, families, and the wider community by creating a safe, welcoming place for recreation.

Children (Primary Beneficiaries): Children ages 5–12 will gain access to a new playground and interactive features that support physical development, coordination, and social skills. With 25.5% of the County’s population under age 18, the project serves a significant share of youth.

Families: With 70% of households in Douglas County classified as family households, the upgraded playground will enhance family recreation, camping, and shared outdoor activities at Corsica Lake.

Individuals with Disabilities: Approximately 10.6% of County residents report a disability, many with ambulatory challenges. The new equipment will improve accessibility and inclusivity, allowing children of varying abilities to play together safely.

Educators and Youth Groups: Local educators, including the Armour Kindergarten class and local Homeschooling families that regularly visits the recreation area, will have improved outdoor learning opportunities that support physical activity, environmental exploration, and social development.

Community and Local Economy: County leaders and nearby communities will benefit from a revitalized recreational asset that strengthens quality of life, attracts visitors, and supports local economic activity tied to camping, fishing, and golf at Corsica Lake and Dakota Trails Golf Course.

Community gathering spaces are vital for families and community connections, especially in rural areas. The 40-year-old playground equipment has become outdated, unsafe, and largely unusable, limiting opportunities for children to play. Replacing it provides a safe, modern, and inclusive space that meets current safety standards and supports recreation and social interaction.

Community Impact and Geographic Reach

The impact of this project extends beyond Douglas County residents to the broader regional population. On any given fair-weather weekend, the recreation area is a busy place. Children and families can be found at the recreational area, enjoying its amenities. New and safe playground equipment and benches would provide a place for the youngest users to enjoy the outdoors while others in their family fish, camp, golf, or hike.

County-Level Impact: The playground serves families across Douglas County, where over one-quarter of residents are children. It supports a large base of family households and provides one of the County's primary outdoor recreation amenities.

Regional Reach: Within a 20-mile radius, the recreation area serves a population of over 7,500 people, including residents of neighboring Charles Mix and Aurora Counties. The site's proximity to Corsica Lake, camping facilities, bathhouses, trails, a boat ramp, a fishing dock, and Dakota Trails Golf Course makes it a regional draw.

Tourism and Seasonal Use: As a lakeside campground and recreation destination, the facility attracts seasonal visitors, traveling families, and outdoor enthusiasts from outside the County, expanding its economic and social impact beyond permanent residents.

Overall, the project will provide safe, accessible recreation for thousands of residents and visitors annually, strengthening both community well-being and regional appeal.

What?

Describe the Project Scope and Proposed Action

The Douglas County Recreation Area playground project will replace the nearly 40-year-old, unsafe equipment with modern, safer, and fully accessible structures that meet today's safety standards and the needs of today's youth. The existing playground sits near a creek along the west side of the recreation area. The proposed new playground would be relocated to a central area, farther from the creek and closer to the bathrooms and campsites. This new location provides a safer, more accessible play environment for children and offers caregivers improved visibility and peace of mind.

Much of the existing equipment is not ADA-compliant, replacement parts are unavailable, and the County's insurance provider has advised that key elements, including the slide and swings, must be removed due to liability concerns. Without grant funding, these structures would be dismantled without replacement, leaving a significantly smaller playground and reducing recreational opportunities for children and families.

The project includes the installation of new playground equipment that better meets the safety and activity needs of today's youth. The new equipment will include a playground system for children ages 5–12, with slides, tunnels, bridges, and climbing apparatuses. There will also be a set of two traditional swings, a tire swing, a teeter-totter, accessible play components, and two benches for caregivers. The design prioritizes safety, durability, and inclusivity so children of varying abilities can play together. These improvements will enhance the overall appeal of the recreation area and complement recent investments in campsites, lake access, a boat ramp, a fishing dock, and the adjacent golf course.

Alternatives were considered. Leaving the playground as-is is not viable due to safety and liability risks. Removing unsafe equipment without replacement would diminish the recreation area's value as a family destination. Community members have requested new equipment for years, and the need has been discussed in commission meetings and budget planning. This project represents a committed investment in safety, accessibility, and long-term recreational and economic vitality.

Public Access and Recreation

The Douglas County Recreation Area playground will remain fully open and accessible to the public as a central feature of the County's outdoor recreation system. Located within an established recreation area that already offers campsites, boat and fishing access, and an adjacent golf course, the playground will complement these amenities to serve residents and visiting families. Its placement within a well-used public site ensures convenient access, ample parking, and visibility, making it a natural gathering space for day visitors and campers alike.

Key features of the project enhance both accessibility and visitor experience. The new playground components are designed to meet current safety standards and allow children of varying abilities to play together. Durable materials and modern safety surfacing further ensure that the playground is functional, low-maintenance, and sustainable for long-term public use. Strengthening this existing recreation area ensures the area remains a vibrant, accessible outdoor space that supports community and regional recreation for years to come.

Accessibility Compliance

The playground will be fully open to the public and designed to meet or exceed current safety and accessibility standards, including compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Consumer Product Safety Commission. In addition to play features, the broader site experience supports accessibility. Benches with companion seating areas will accommodate caregivers with mobility devices, and clear sightlines will allow easy supervision.

Environmental Sustainability and Longevity

This project promotes environmental sustainability and long-term durability by investing in high-quality, low-maintenance materials designed to withstand heavy use and harsh seasonal weather conditions common in rural South Dakota. The new playground structures will use coated steel, recycled plastic, and weather-resistant components that resist corrosion, rot, and fading—significantly extending the equipment's life.

By replacing failing equipment, the County reduces the need for frequent repairs, part replacements, and emergency removals, lowering material waste over time. The project also strengthens and upgrades the existing recreation footprint rather than expanding into undisturbed land, preserving natural resources and avoiding unnecessary environmental disturbance. Enhancing an already-developed site near established recreational activities ensures that infrastructure investments are concentrated where utilities, parking, and access already exist.

Where?

Site Characteristics and Desirability

The Douglas County Recreation Area is a highly suitable and appealing site for public outdoor recreation due to its natural beauty, established amenities, and central role as a regional gathering place. Located along Corsica Lake and surrounded by the distinctive Prairie Pothole landscape, the site offers scenic wetlands, abundant wildlife, and open space that naturally enhance outdoor play and exploration. Existing features—including campsites, lake access, fishing dock, bathhouses, trails, and the adjacent Dakota Trails Golf Course—create a well-developed recreation hub that already attracts families, youth groups, and visitors from across Douglas County and neighboring communities.

Current site conditions strongly support the goals of the playground upgrade. The area is easily accessible, highly visible, and already serves as one of the County’s primary outdoor destinations, making it an ideal location for safe, inclusive play equipment. The setting provides ample room for families to gather, educators to bring students for outdoor learning, and children of varying abilities to participate in recreation close to other amenities they already use.

Relationships to other projects and community planning

A broader redevelopment concept for the Douglas County Recreation Area was first explored in 2007 through the Design: SD community visioning process, which proposed expanded park amenities. Several improvements that stemmed from the study, including additional campsites, a new boat ramp, a fishing dock, and enhancements to the nearby golf course, have since been completed and proved to be successful investments.

Upgrading the playground aligns directly with the long-term vision for the Recreation Area and continues a steady, phased approach to site improvements. Over the years, the County has consistently invested in enhancing the space: adding campsites, improving lake access, installing a new boat ramp, and supporting upgrades at the adjacent golf course. A new bathhouse is also currently under construction and is expected to be finished later this year. Replacing the outdated playground equipment is the next logical

step, addressing one of the few remaining features that no longer meet current safety or accessibility standards.

This project also reflects broader community priorities identified through past planning efforts, including the 2007 Design: SD visioning process, which highlighted the Recreation Area as a key community asset. The need for modern playground equipment has been repeatedly voiced by residents, frequent campers, and county leaders, and has been discussed in commission meetings and budget planning for several years. The County has already committed funding toward park improvements, demonstrating a clear and ongoing commitment to maintaining and upgrading this important community resource.

Why?

Project Needs and Goals

The objective of this project is to enhance outdoor recreational opportunities for the children of Douglas County by upgrading the aging play equipment at the Douglas County Recreation Area. The park serves as a central gathering place for families who enjoy the outdoors, yet its current playground no longer meets the safety, accessibility, or engagement needs of local youth. Investing in modern, inclusive play structures will significantly improve the park's functionality and ensure that children and families can enjoy a safe, high-quality recreational environment for years to come.

This project also supports broader community goals by contributing to local economic vitality. Well-maintained parks attract more visitors, encourage longer stays, and increase participation in community events, all of which generate economic activity. Enhanced outdoor amenities strengthen the county's overall quality of life, helping retain residents, attract new families, and support workforce stability—key factors in sustaining rural economies.

In addition to its recreational and economic benefits, the project advances the mission of the Recreation Area to celebrate and protect the natural beauty of the Prairie Potholes that define much of Douglas County's landscape. These glacially formed wetlands are among the most important ecosystems in North America, providing essential habitat for countless species and serving as natural flood-control systems that absorb rain, snowmelt, and excess runoff. By investing in the Recreation Area, this project enriches the lives of local children, strengthens the regional economy, and promotes stewardship of an ecologically significant landscape.

Outdoor Recreation Benefits

In the short term, replacing the nearly 40-year-old equipment eliminates existing safety hazards and restores a fully functional play space that children can use right away. Families, youth groups, and visitors will gain immediate access to modern, inclusive structures that support active play, social interaction, and outdoor learning. The new equipment also improves the overall quality of the recreation area by creating a more welcoming, reliable, and enjoyable experience for everyone who uses the park.

Long-term, the project strengthens the Recreation Area as a central outdoor destination for the county and the surrounding region. By installing durable, ADA-compliant equipment, the project ensures that children of varying abilities can participate in recreation for years to come, expanding access and promoting equity. The upgraded playground complements existing amenities, enhancing the site's appeal for both residents and visitors. These improvements support sustained community use, encourage healthy outdoor activity, and reinforce the park's role as a gathering place for families, educators, and youth programs.

Existing and Planned Uses

The recreation area is for recreation and public use. There are no known conflicts with LWCF requirements.

SCORP Priorities and Local Planning Alignment

The 2023 SCORP provides ample justification for this project. The 2023 Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP), Strategy #1 page 3.4, states, "Provide and promote year-round, diverse outdoor recreation opportunities for South Dakotans of all ages, interests, economic status and ability." The strategy is supported by the first objective, "Develop additional diverse outdoor recreational facilities and renovate/replace existing ones to meet current demands." The strategy is further supported by the objective, "Provide more universally accessible outdoor recreation facilities and opportunities" and action, "Design and construct outdoor recreation facilities for varying ages, mobility and ability levels, especially playgrounds, trails and the like, so that multiple age and mobility groups can enjoy the experience." The proposed playground improvement project is consistent with priorities that are ranked as "high" (page 3.6) under Strategy 1.

The project ultimately aligns with Strategy #2 on page 3.7 of the 2023 SCORP: "Maintain and improve existing park and recreation areas, open spaces, and facilities for outdoor recreation opportunities." Playgrounds are a high priority for all classes of cities in the state under Strategy 2, "Projects that maintain, improve or update existing outdoor recreation facilities, when the availability of other federal matching fund programs is not possible or practical. Projects may include playgrounds, sports courts and fields, trails and tracks, swimming pools and other renovated facilities."

Public Involvement and Planning

The development of this project reflects sustained community input, public discussion, and alignment with long-term planning for the Douglas County Recreation Area.

Community engagement began with the 2007 Design:SD workshop, where residents, local leaders, and design professionals collaborated to identify priorities for improving Corsica Lake and the recreation area. Since then, families, campers, and county residents have consistently emphasized the need to replace the aging playground equipment due to safety concerns.

Public involvement has continued through county commission meetings, budget discussions, and outreach efforts tied to previous funding applications. In 2024 and 2025, the County applied for LWCF funding and shared project information through public meetings and online postings. Although those applications were not funded, they generated additional community feedback and reinforced the project's importance. A project summary was posted to the County website in 2026 to keep residents informed ahead of the current LWCF application. The County also presented the project to community leaders and donors, securing support from the local community foundation and demonstrating strong local backing.

Community feedback, safety concerns, and insurance recommendations all helped prioritize the project and shape its design. The upgrade aligns with phased improvements already completed at the Recreation Area and supports the broader community vision established through Design:SD and ongoing planning. The result is a well-supported, community-driven project that advances long-term goals for safe, accessible, and high-quality outdoor recreation in Douglas County.

How?

Describe the planning process that led to the development of this proposal.

The playground upgrade at the Douglas County Recreation Area was identified and prioritized through long-standing planning efforts and consistent community support. The need first emerged during the 2007 Design:SD visioning process, where residents, county leaders, and design professionals highlighted the outdated playground and called for safer, modern amenities. Over nearly 20 years, Douglas County has invested in the Recreation Area, and the community has appreciated and benefited from the improvements.

The County's insurance provider has advised that several pieces of the 40-year-old equipment must be removed because they no longer meet modern safety standards and cannot be repaired. This guidance has played a major role in elevating the project as an immediate need.

Public engagement and involvement have been a part of the process since the beginning. The county is aware of and supportive of this project. County staff continues to apply for funding assistance from different sources, as local county funds are not available to pay for the project in its entirety. The chosen equipment and decisions to seek funding have been discussed for years, and the need for the new equipment continues to grow each year.

Cost Estimates

The project budget was developed using detailed vendor quotes for the new playground structures, swings, inclusive components, surfacing, and installation. These quotes reflect current material and freight. The budget includes all major components—equipment purchase, installation labor, safety surfacing, and site amenities. The playground equipment chosen was based on what is currently offered at the playground and on current playground trends.

Because the project stays within the existing recreation footprint, no major site work or utility expenses are anticipated. Overall, the budget is well-supported, realistic, and based on current market pricing and documented project needs.

Management and Operations

Douglas County will continue to manage and operate the site, as they have done for many years.

Douglas County has a long-standing history of successfully utilizing and maintaining Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) investments. The County was awarded LWCF funding in the late 1970s and early 1980s (Project #4601023 and #4600469), which supported the development of key park amenities, including the original playground, boat ramp, restrooms, picnic facilities, and electrical hookups. Since that time, the County has remained fully committed to the intent and requirements of the program by consistently maintaining, repairing, and, when necessary, replacing these amenities to ensure continued public use and accessibility. Examples of this would include replacing the dilapidated boat ramp, maintaining the road to access the ramp, replacing all picnic tables and electrical hookups, and updating the original bathhouse. Douglas County has remained in full compliance with LWCF requirements, including timely submission of inspection reports and adherence to all original grant guidelines.

Building on this legacy of responsible stewardship, the County is currently undertaking a full replacement of the original vault toilet (installed as part of the initial LWCF-funded

project) with a new bathhouse facility. This new structure will include separate men’s and women’s restrooms with toilet stalls, shower facilities, and a storage area to support ongoing park maintenance operations. This project reflects the County’s continued investment in improving recreational infrastructure while honoring the long-term obligations of prior LWCF funding.

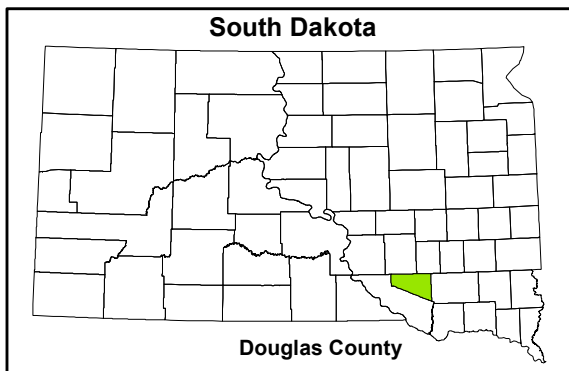
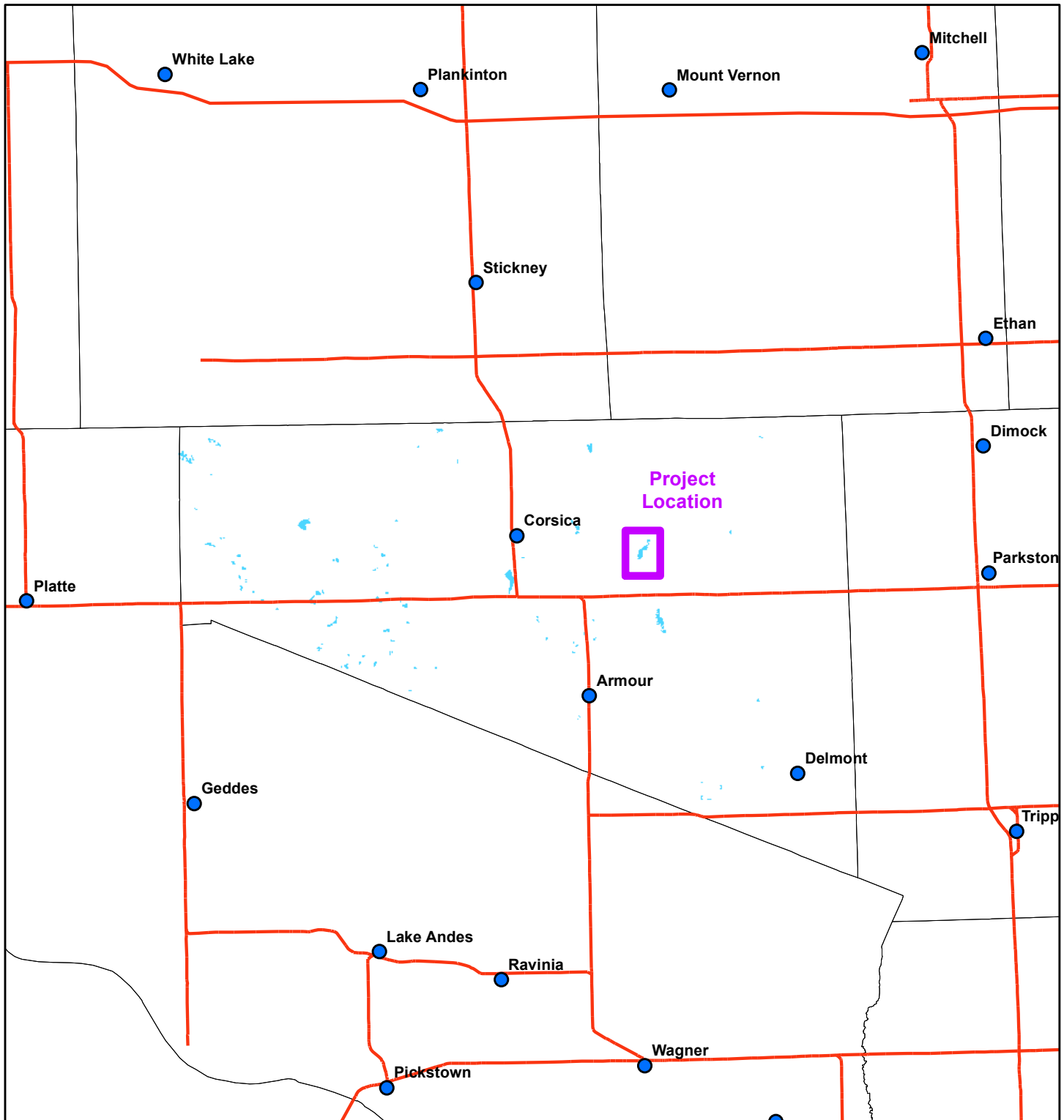

This is not the action Douglas County wants to take, so they are actively working to secure more funding to make this project fit within their available funds. However, there is simply not enough budget to fund this whole project.



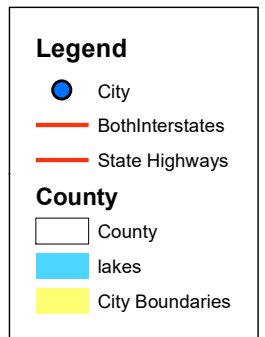
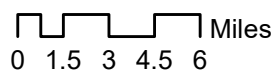

- SITE LOCATION MAP

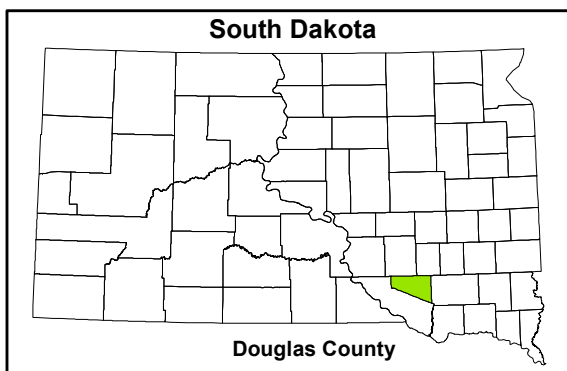
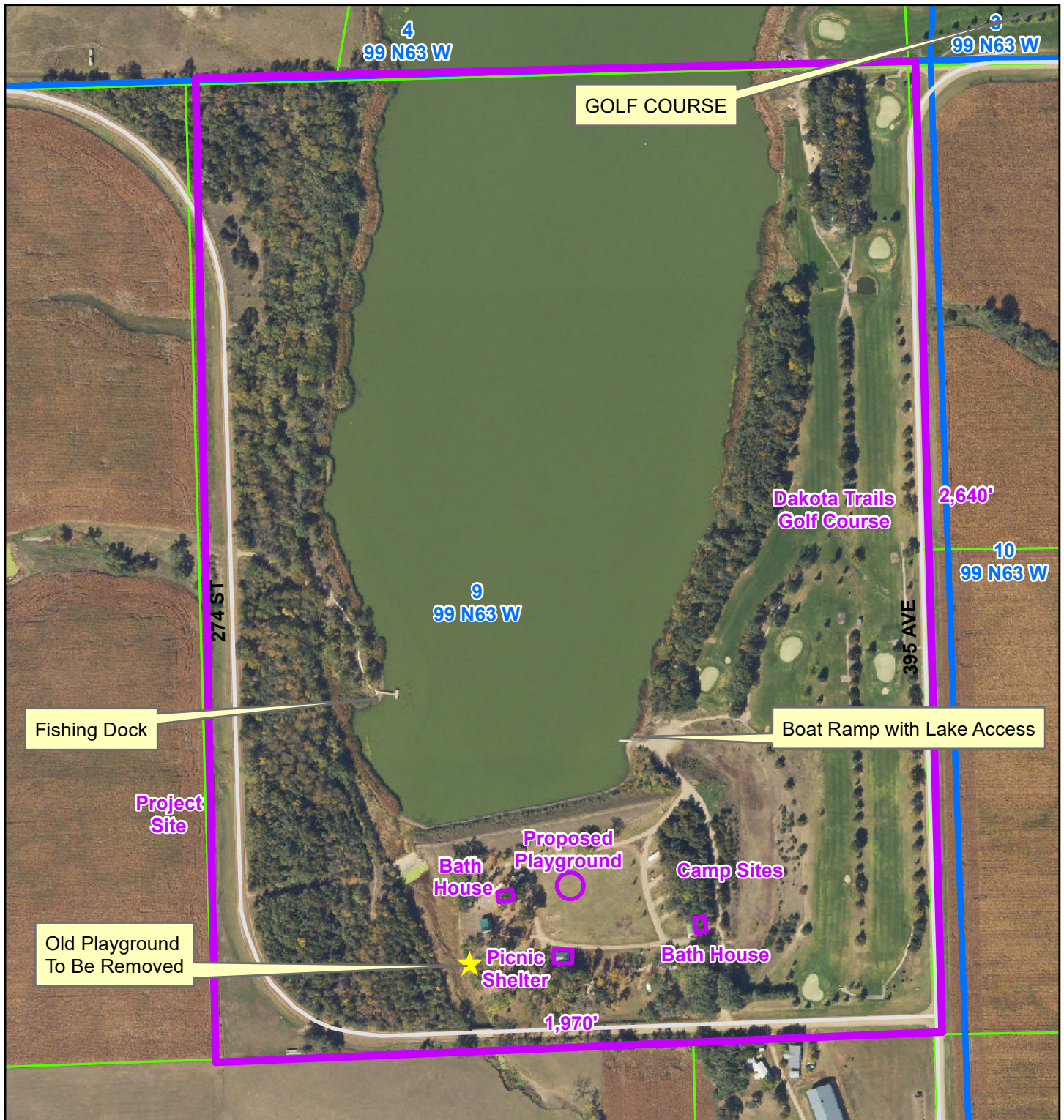
Douglas County Playground Equipment Project

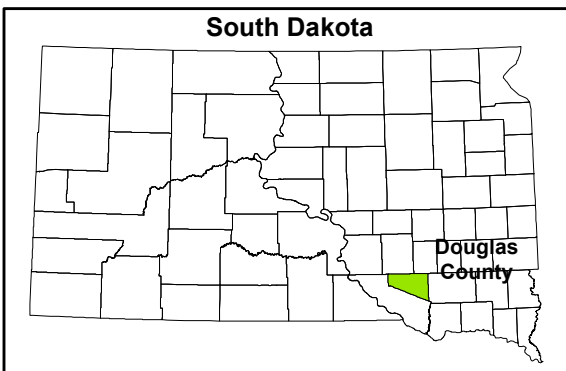

PARK BOUNDARY MAP



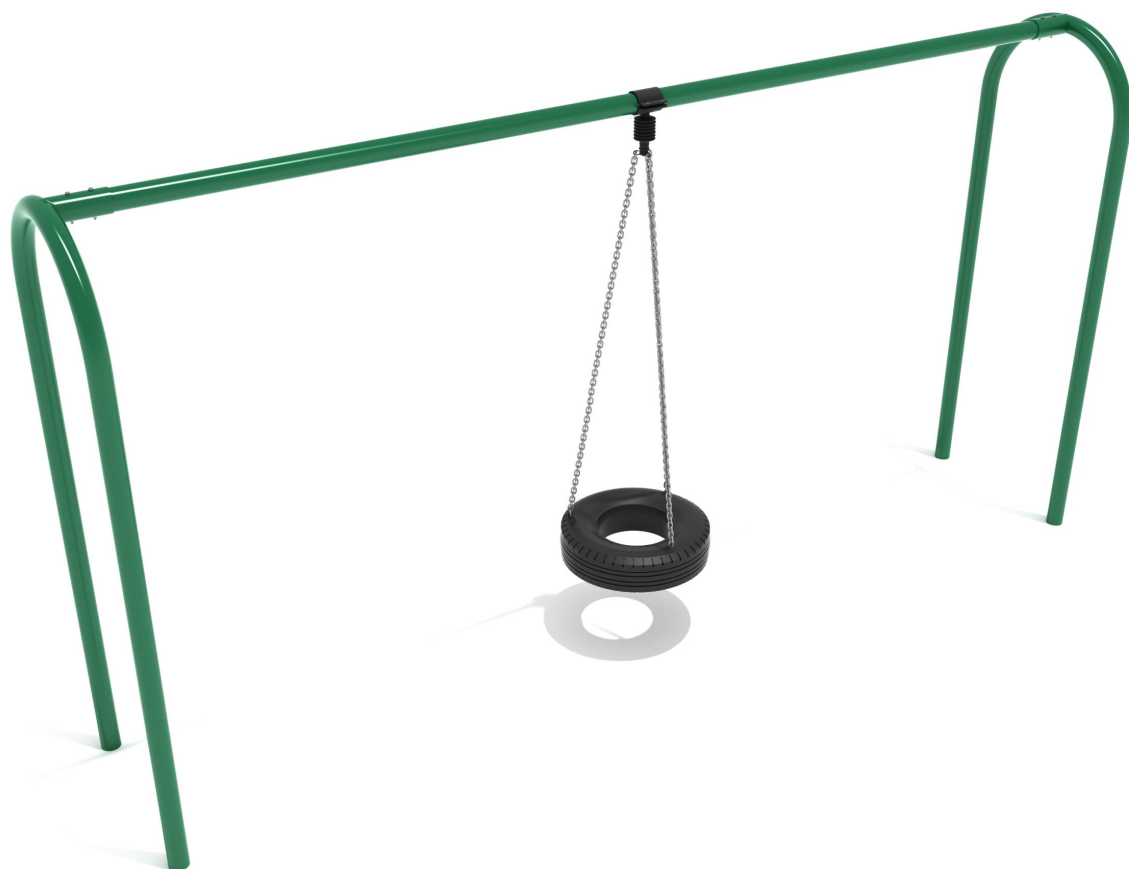

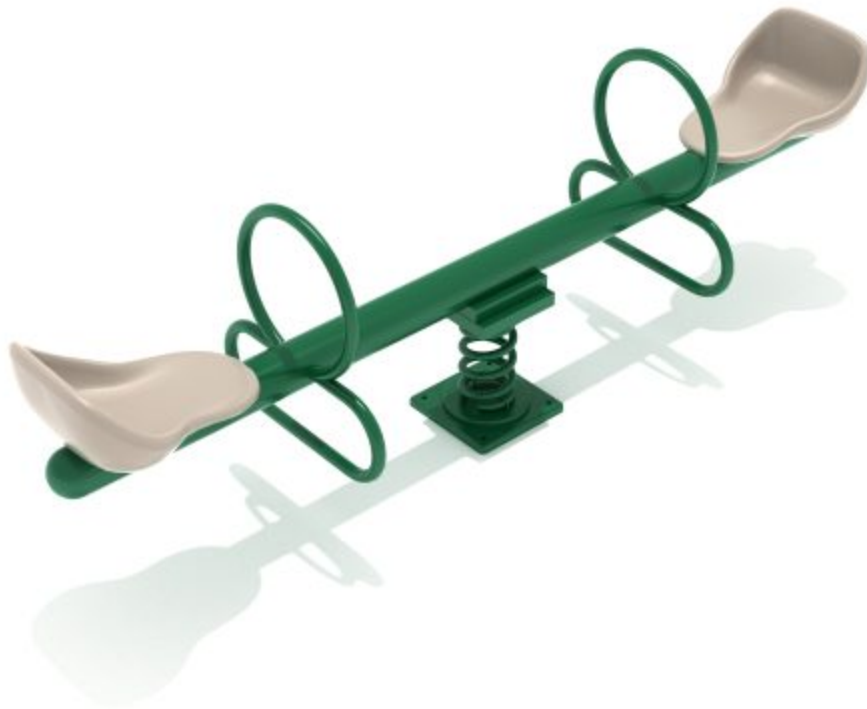
